Structure situated close to street, which has been widened over the years. Large side (south) lot leading to fast-running stream. Rear yard contains garage, with drive along north elevation. Rear yard leads to mill pond created from Clinton River, on west side of property.

Dominant structure in district because of position in relation to Main Street. One of only two ornate, turreted Queen Anne homes in district. Owned by same family since 1908, and associated with period during which Clarkston was a summer tourist destination.

20. Historical Significance:

Abstract of property shows that Henry Kinsley purchased the vacant property from the Clark family for \$500. On March 10, 1908 Kinsley sold the property to M/M Charles Lambert for \$3500, leading to an assumption that the property had been considerably improved in the intervening years. Mr. Lambert died in 1921, and his widow in 1943, leaving the property to son Frank and his wife Elizabeth. Frank died in 1953; his widow still owns and lives in the house.

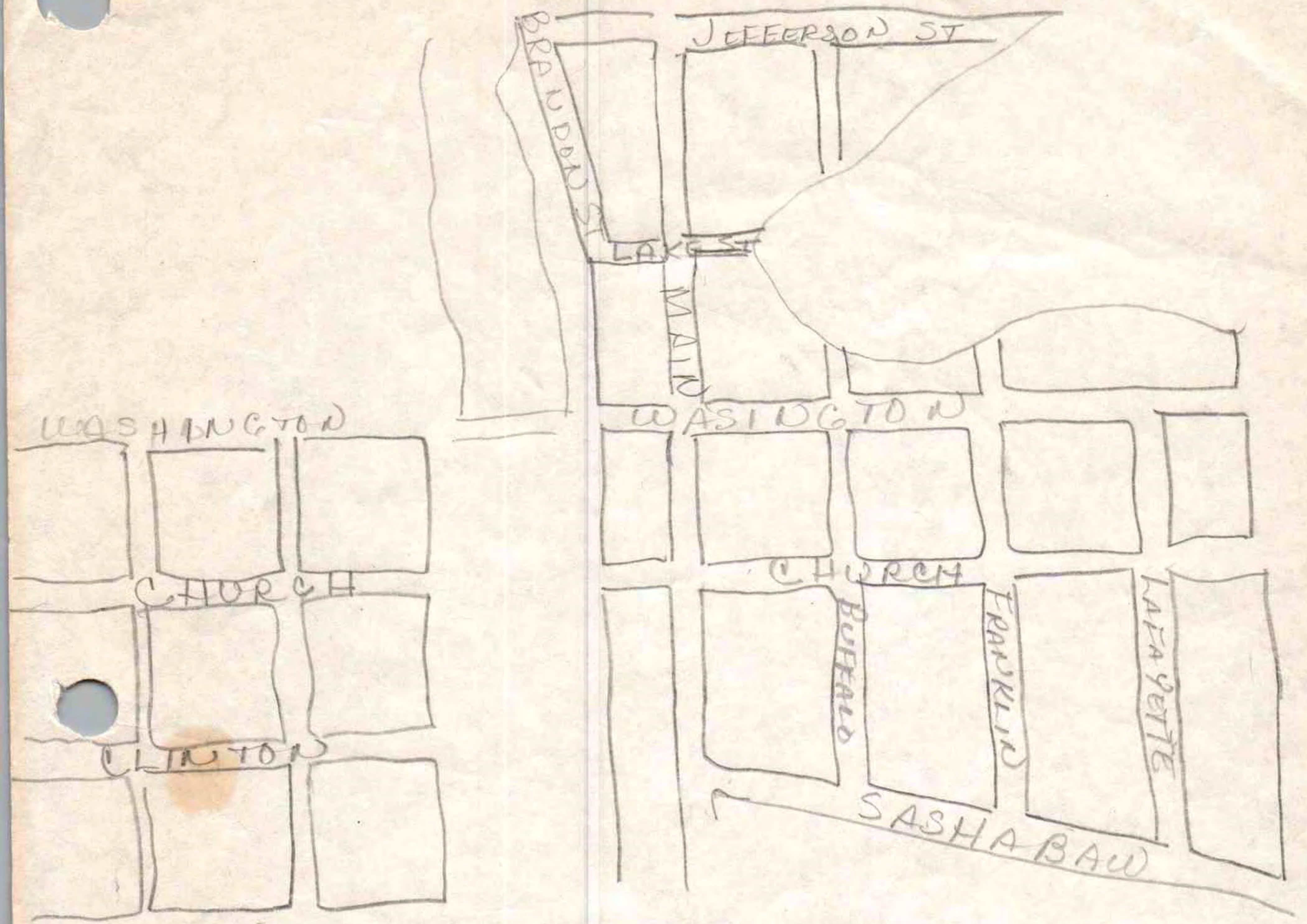
